



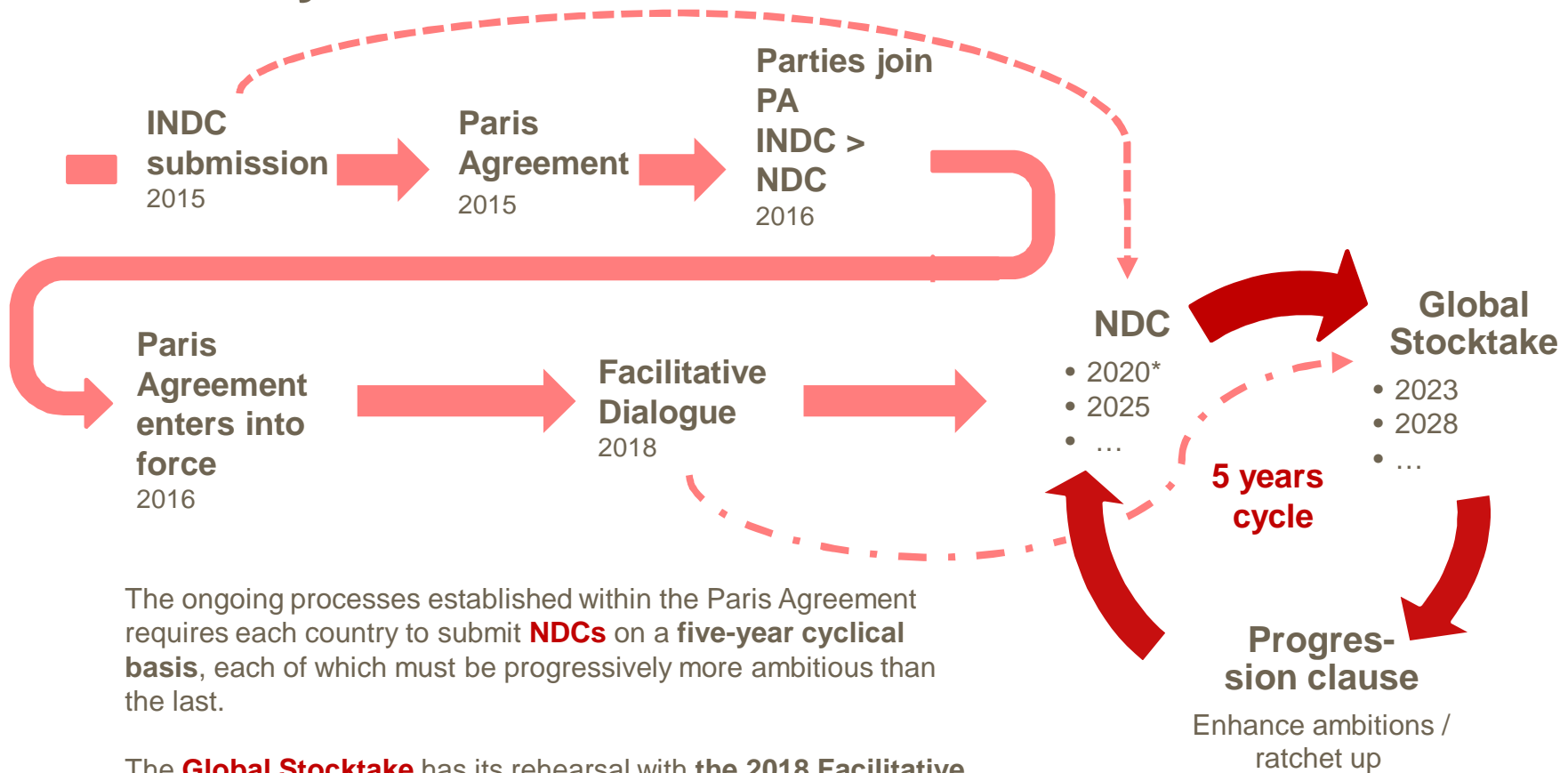
NDC cycles and the ambition mechanism under the Paris Climate Change Agreement

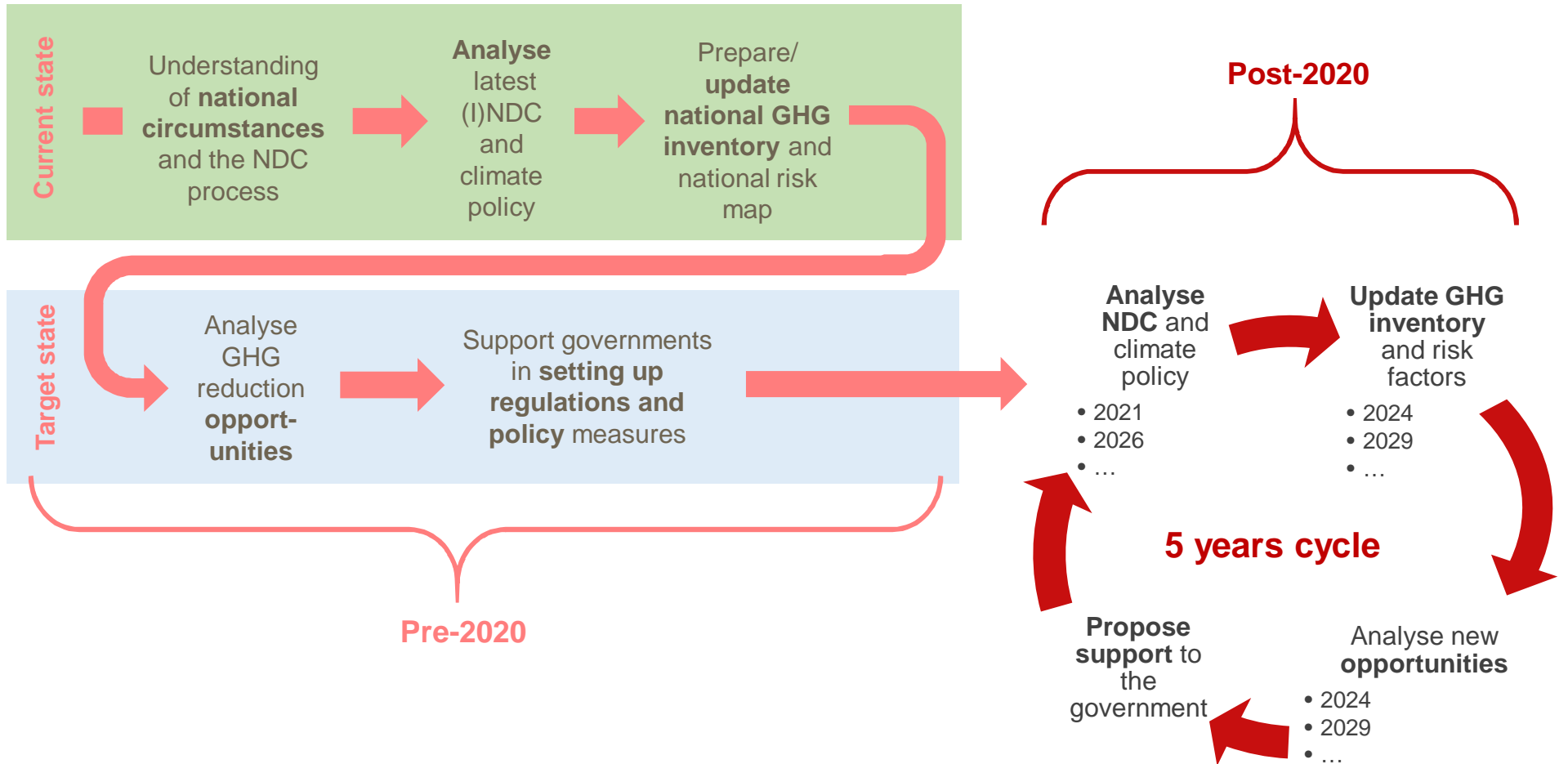


NDC cycle



The ongoing processes established within the Paris Agreement requires each country to submit **NDCs** on a **five-year cyclical basis**, each of which must be progressively more ambitious than the last.

The **Global Stocktake** has its rehearsal with **the 2018 Facilitative Dialogue** and then is carried out in on a **five-year cyclical basis** from 2023 onwards always following 2 years after submitting the revised NDCs.





Fields of activities pre-2020

Reporting support for pre-2020 period

- Support for second BURs (2016 - 2018*)
- GHG inventory (2016 - 2020)
- Preparation support for the 2020 NDCs (2016 - 2020)
- Long-term decarbonisation plan (2016 - 2020)

Support host governments with financial proposals, technology development and capacity-building

- Access international financial support – knowledge sharing for proposal compiling
- Access international technology transfer
- Provide technical trainings and seminars about NDC implementation and MRV requirements building capacity for agencies
